

## Corrections to books by Ann Budd

All of the corrections (of which I'm aware) since the first printing are listed below by book. Depending on when your copy was printed, these corrections may have been made. All corrections are highlighted in yellow.

### The Knitter's Handy Book of Patterns

The book does not list the row gauges. The following row gauges were used:

3 stitches/inch; 5 rows/inch

4 stitches/inch; 6 rows/inch

5 stitches/inch; 7 rows/inch

6 stitches/inch; 8 rows/inch

7 stitches/inch; 9 rows/inch

### The Knitter's Handy Book of Sweater Patterns

3 stitches/inch; 5 rows/inch

#### Page 166 (Ribbed-Sleeve Pullover)

Left column, last line and continuing to right column, Set-Up row should read:

\*[k3, p1] 2 times, [k1, p1] 22 times, [k3, p1] 2 times; rep from \*.

#### Page 167 (Ribbed-Sleeve Pullover)

Right column, third line Next rnd: (Dec rnd) should read:

\*Ssk, work in rib patt as established to last 2 sleeve sts, k2tog, sl m, p1, k3, sl m, ssk, knit to last 6 sts of front, k2tog, sl m, p1, k3; rep from \* for rem sleeve and back—8 sts dec'd.

### The Knitter's Handy Book of Top-Down Sweaters

3 stitches/inch; 5 rows/inch

4 stitches/inch; 6 rows/inch

5 stitches/inch; 7 rows/inch

#### Page 33 (Seamless Yoke, adult sizes)

For Pullover Option work 1 rnd even before shaping the shoulders.

For Cardigan Option work 1 WS row even before shaping the shoulders.

#### Page 60 (Quince-Essential Fair Isle)

Left column, second line (second sentence of Sleeves) should read:

Join MC and knit these sts, then **pick up and knit** 2 (2, 3, 3, 4) sts along first half of CO edge of underarm, pm, **pick up and knit** 2 (2, 3, 3, 4) more sts—34 (38, 42, 46, 50) sts total.

### Page 81 (Raglan, adult sizes)

Add the following sentence after the third chart of numbers:

**After all neck increases have been completed, join the two fronts on the next RS row and continue working the raglan increases as established.**

### Page 117 (Set-In Sleeve, child sizes)

Right column, first chart of numbers should read:

### Page 125 (Set-In Sleeve, child sizes)

Left column, add the following sentence after "All sts will have been worked; last wrapped st at each side is next to m in center of underarm":

**Wrapping final wraps tog with wrapped sts, work** even in rnds for 1" (2.5 cm).

### Page 174 (Saddle Shoulder, child sizes)

Left column, sentence before the third chart of numbers should read:

Knitting the first st of every row (these garter edge sts will make it easier to pick up sts along the selvages later), work in desired patt until piece measures the foll length from CO, ending with a **RS** row.

### Page 177 (Saddle Shoulder, child sizes)

Left column, last sentence plus added sentence (under Crewneck Style) should read:

**Working each set of front sts separately, work 1 WS row even. Work short-rows to shape the shoulders as for back and at the same time shape neck as foll:**

### Page 178 (Saddle Shoulder, child sizes)

Right column, add the following sentence to bottom of page (under V-Neck Style):

**Work short-rows to shape the shoulders as for back and at the same time shape neck as foll:**

### **Page 187 (Saddle Shoulder, adult sizes)**

Sentence before the third chart of numbers should read:

Knitting the first st of every row (these garter edge sts will make it easier to pick up sts along the selvages later), work in desired patt until piece measures the foll length from CO, ending with a **RS** row.

### **Page 192 (Saddle Shoulder, adult sizes)**

First two sentences after Crewneck Style heading should read:

Working each set of front sts separately, work 1 WS row even. **Work short-rows to shape the shoulders ad for back and at the same time shape the neck as foll:**

### **Page 229 (Zigs & Zags)**

Right column, the number of sts to pick up for the Front Bands and Collar should read:

With A, smaller cir needle in longer length, RS facing, and beg at lower right front edge, pick up and knit 70 (64, 65, 62, 56) sts to base of V-neck shaping, pm, **58 (60, 68, 80, 93)** sts to beg of saddle, 26 (29, 33, 35, 36) sts across right saddle, 46 (48, 50, 56, 60) sts across back neck, 26 (29, 33, 35, 36) sts across left saddle, **58 (60, 68, 80, 93)** sts to base of V-neck shaping, pm, and 70 (64, 65, 62 56) sts to lower left front edge—**354 (354, 382, 410, 430)** sts total.

## **Sock Knitting Master Class**

### **Page 61 (French Market Socks)**

Left column, Joining Rnd should read:

With Needle 1, work last 4 heel sts as k3 with A, k1 with B, then pick up and knit 12 sts along side of heel flap as [k5 with **A**, k1 with **B**] 2 times; with Needle 2 ... (rest of sentence is correct).

### **Page 89 (Twisted-Stitch Stockings)**

Left column, Set-Up Rnd under Instep should read:

(Rnd 4 of Chart A) Ssk, work 11 sts in patt, place last 8 sts just worked (center sts of Chart A) on waste yarn holder to work later for back of heel, work **3 sts** in patt, **k2tog, work in patt to end of Chart C, then work the 4 sts from beg of Chart A before the held center heel sts as they appear**—54 sts rem.

### **Page 91 (Twisted-Stitch Stockings)**

Chart A, Row 3, Stitch 9:

This center stitch should be a **left twist** (not left traveler).

### **Page 121 (Toe-Up Construction)**

Figure 4 of the Tubular Bind-Off should be the same the Figure 2.

### **Page 163 (Pussy Willow Stockings)**

Last sentence before “Heel” should read:

Rep these 5 rnds 7 (8) more times, then work Rnds 1-3 once more—83 (94) sts total; 55 (62) sts on instep needle; 28 (32) sts on sole needle; m A is still positioned **before the last 17 (19)** sts of instep needle.

### **Page 164 (Pussy Willow Stockings)**

Left column, top of page under Next Row should read:

(WS) Sl 1 pwise with yarn in front (wyf), purl to wrapped sts, work next 6 (7) sts tog with their wraps, work rem wrapped st tog with its wrap while working it tog with last st as **p3tog**, turn—1 heel st dec'd; 27 (31) heel sts rem.

## **New Directions in Sock Knitting**

### **Page 29 (Crystalline)**

Right column, last sentence (Next Short-Row) should read:

(RS) sl 1 pwise **wyb**, k38 to end at marker, do not turn work.

### **Page 67 (Mitered Triangles)**

Left column, Garter ridge under First Sole Panel should read:

With Rosy Pink, **knit** 1 WS row, then place 10 sts at end of panel onto holder.

Left column, Pick-up row under First Sole Panel should read:

(WS) With attached strand of Rosy Pink and WS of panel facing, pick up and **purl** 9 sts along selvedge... (rest of sentence is correct).

Left column, Garter ridge under Second Sole Panel should read:

With Yellow Green, **purl** 1 RS row, then place 10 sts at end of panel onto holder.

Right column, first sentence of First Heel Triangle should read:

With smaller needles, Yellow Gold, and leaving a 30” (76 cm) tail, use the **backward-loop** method ... (rest of sentence is correct).

Right column, first sentence of Second Heel Triangle should read:

With smaller needles, Rusty Rose, and leaving a 30” (76 cm) tail, use the **backward-loop** method ... (rest of sentence is correct).

### **Page 68 (Mitered Triangles)**

Right column, Pick-up row under Second Back Leg Panel should read:

(WS) With attached strand of Fuchsia and WS of panel facing, pick up and purl 9 sts along selvedge of Fuchsia triangle, then 10 sts each along Purple Rose and Dusty Violet panels, then **purl** 1 Rusty Rose heel st from holder—30 sts total.

### **Page 73 (Harlequin)**

Right column, Winding Yarn into Butterflies should read:

Extend the thumb and index finger of your left hand, loop the yarn around your thumb, and trap the end against your palm with the other three fingers. Wrap the yarn in a figure-eight around your thumb and index finger for the desired length (Figure 1). Cut the yarn, leaving a 12" (30.5 cm) tail. Remove the butterfly from your hand and hold it in the middle while you wrap the tail firmly around the bundle a few times in the opposite direction, then slip the tail underneath one of the wraps, and pull tight to secure (Figure 2). Pull the yarn from the center of the butterfly, beginning with the end that was held against the palm of your hand.

### Page 77 (Harlequin)

Left column, Short-Row 1 should read:

(RS) k11 (13) MC, k5 D, k11 (13) MC, k2A, k1B, k2A, sl 1 pwise with yarn in front (wyf), turn work.

### Page 123 (Seed Beds)

Sole Toe Chart, Row 12, stitch 1 should be M1F and last stitch should be M1B; the stitches between these end sts are correct.

### Page 132 (Vanishing Point)

Right Column, fifth line of Row 7 should read:

... before Marker 2, M1R, k1, sl m, k1, M1L, knit to last 12 sts ...

### Page 145 (Smokey ZickZacks)

Left column, fifth line of Row 1 should read:

... yo of the inc after the magic loop in the cir needle so that ...

### Page 151 (Glossary)

Left column, Decrease Bind-Off

Both illustrations are incorrect—the text is correct.

## Knitted Gifts

### Page 52 (Fresco Leg Warmers)

Add the following Note under the chart key:

Note: The Lower Leg and Upper Leg charts only show the pattern rounds; work 1 round even (knit the knits and purl the purls) after every chart round.

Left column, last sentence before Inc rnd should read:

Working a plain rnd (knit the knits and purl the purls) after every chart rnd, work Rnds 1 – 9 of Lower Leg chart.

Right column, first sentence should read:

Knitting the inc'd sts and working a plain rnd after every chart rnd, work 9 chart rnds in patt as established, then rep inc rnd 4 more times, ending with chart Rnd 50 ... (rest of sentence is correct).

### **Page 88 (Sugar & Spice Blanket)**

Right column, fourth and fifth lines should read:

...selvedge sts, pm, pick up and purl 198 sts across bottom border of blanket, pm, pick up and purl 198 sts ... (rest of sentence is correct).

### **Page 102 (His & Her Socks)**

Left column, Stitch Guide should include:

Broken Rib Instep Pattern (worked over 6 sts)

Rnds 1-3 and 5-7: K2, p2, k2.

Rnds 4, 8, 12, and 16: Purl.

Rnds 9-11 and 13-15: P2, k2, p2.

Rep Rnds 1-16 for pattern.

### **Page 103 (His & Her Socks)**

Left column, first sentence of Foot should read:

Working bottom-of-foot sts in St st, the first 6 and last 6 instep sts in patt as established for checkerboard rib patt or according to Rnds 1-16 of Broken Rib Instep patt, and center 14 (18, 22) sts in k2, p2 or p2, k2 rib as desired, work even until foot measures about ... (rest of sentence is correct).

### **Page 110 (Animal Crackers)**

Left column, sentence before Shape Armholes should read:

Maintaining selvedge sts, work Rows 1-4 of spot patt across center 18 (89, 97) sts 18 (20, 22) times.

### **Page 112 (Animal Crackers)**

Right column, add the following to end of Seams section:

Turn hem to WS along picot row and with MC threaded on a tapestry needle, loosely sew in place. Rep for sleeve cuffs.

### **Page 121 (Headband)**

Left column, Row 1 should read:

(RS) [Sl 1 kwise with yarn in back (wyb)] 2 times, knit to last 3 sts, sl 1 pwise, k1, p1.

Left column, Row 2 should read:

(WS) Sl 1 kwise wyb, sl 1 pwise with yarn in front (wyf), p1, knit to last 3 sts, sl 1 pwise wyf, p1 through back loop (tbl), p1.

### **Page 135 (Glossary)**

Right column, Long-Tail (Continental) Cast-On should read:

### Knitting Green

#### Page 39 (Back-to-Nature Hat)

Left column, first Next Row should read:

(RS; Row 1 of chart) Using the intarsia method and a separate strand for each color section, \*[p1, k2, p2] with A, k15 with B; rep from \* to end, then wrap next st.

#### Page 40 (Back-to-Nature Hat)

Left column, Tree and Cable chart, Row 1:

All 15 sts in the green shaded portion of Row 1 of the chart should be knit sts (no purls).

### Scarf Style 2

#### Page 121 (Duplex)

Row 49 should read:

(RS; eyelet row) Sl 1 pwise wyb, k1, \*yo, k2tog; rep from \* to last st, k1.

### Simple Style

None.

### Lace Style

#### Page 23 (Lily of the Valley Shawl)

Rows 11 and 13 of the corner portion of the Edging Chart should read:

K1, yo, k2, [sl 1 kwise, k2tog, pss0], k3, yo, k1, yo, k3, [sl 1 kwise, k2tog, pss0], k2, yo, k1 ... (repeat section is correct).

#### Page 119 (Never Wimpy Wimple)

Rnds 7 – 12 of Top Edging should read:

Rnd 7: Knit.

Rnds 8, 10, and 12: \*K7, k2tog, yo, k3; rep from \*.

Rnds 9 and 11: \*K6, k2tog, yo, k1, yo, k2tog, k1; rep from \*.

### Wrap Style

#### Page 55 (Grand Plan Top-Down Capelets)

The turtleneck set-up row should read:

\*P2, k3, [p2, k2] 3 times, p2, k3, p2, place marker (pm) to denote ... (rest of sentence is correct).

## The Best of Interweave Knits

### Page 33 (Lace Peignoir and Simple Shell)

The schematic for the shell is missing the measurement for the front neck drop. It should read: **1" (2.5 cm)**

### Page 72 (Water Garden Fair Isle)

The key has the wrong color/symbol for "purl with appropriate color". The symbol should be **grey with a white square** (used in ribbing).

### Page 153 (Beyond the Basics: Grafting)

Left column, Stockinette Stitch, Joining Pieces Top to Top

Figures 1 and 2 are labeled incorrectly: **what's labeled as Figure 1 is actually Figure 2; what's labeled as Figure 2 is actually Figure 1.**
